



To our **Health**


- Plastics can leach harmful chemicals into our bodies that mess with our hormones.



THREE TREES FOR ARBOR DAY

he planting of trees has long been a tradition of the West Trenton Garden Club. In the early days of our club, members planted trees in April to celebrate the national tree holiday — Arbor Day. The Publicity Committee would send photos of the tree planting ceremonies to newspapers, encouraging the public to plant trees. Featured tree planting occurred at significant locations such as Fisk Elementary School. A tree was planted in Banchoff Park in celebrate the Garden Club's 50th Anniversary. As part of this ongoing tradition, trees have been distributed in Ewing Township every Arbor Day. Club volunteers have provided sapling trees to the public at the Mercer County Library, Ewing branch. Additionally, a tree poem is read to children during story hour.

People receiving these trees have returned year after year showing pictures and telling

stories about their trees. Once again, trees will be distributed to the public this Arbor Day. The trees have been grown and raised at the New Jersey Forestry Nursery in Jackson. About 90 red oak trees will be distributed on April 25th. Our tradition has been inspired by a New Jersey poet

Joyce Kilmer. His poem, "Trees," was written honoring a red oak growing on the grounds Rutgers University. Today, we are inspired by our state poet, and look forward to planting our state tree, the red oak.
