## President's Report

The West Trenton Garden Club meeting of October 6, 2025, was called to order at 6:32 pm by President *Anne Skalka*. Anne asked if there were any guests present, but there were none.

## Secretary's Report

The minutes of the September meeting were printed in the monthly Newsletter. Hearing no additions or corrections, the minutes were filed as reported.

## Treasurer's Report

Treasurer, *Rick Lazarick*, reported a current balance of \$8,350.98. Since the last meeting, there was income of \$360.00 (\$42.00 from September's 50/50 and \$318.00 from the Bulb Sale, and expenses totalling \$1,861.00 (\$696.50 for Yearbook printing, \$33.00 NJ Treasury annual filing fee, and \$608.58 Bulb Sale payment Part 1). Club membership stands at 63.

## **Committee Reports**

- *Fall Bulb Sale Rick Lazarick* reported that the Bulb Sale has netted \$522.00 so far before selling the orphans, which he brought to the meeting.
- Program Committee Iliana Okum reported that the program that has been scheduled for November's meeting is a floral design presentation entitled "Holiday Table Chic: Floral Arranging for Entertaining" by Deborah Pomroy. The designs will follow Garden Club guidelines for flower show exhibits. Iliana also presented certificates to Helga Fontus and Anne Chmielewski for organizing last month's informative program at the last minute.
- Birmingham Park George McElrath thanked Lynn Grillo for donating a retractable hose to the Park. He also thanked Paula Fisher, Matt Kowalski, Anne Skalka, Linda Geiger, Susan Crystal, Heidi Furman, and Vernon Clash for coming out in September for Fall clean-up at the Park. Two new salvias will be planted on either side of the Blue Star Memorial to replace the two plants that died over the summer. Heidi Furman added that the sign advertising Ewing's Community Days has been moved to a different spot instead of blocking the Blue Star Memorial.

### Class 8 "Teatime in the Apple Orchard"

(4 entries)

What better way to spend a fall day, picking apples and enjoying cinnamon spiced tea! A Functional Tray for One (Informal) – Exhibitor to provide tray not to exceed 19"W x 16"D or 18" round. Staged on a quarter of a 60" round table 29" from floor. A decorative unit is required. Designer's choice of plant material and other components. Viewed from the front. HB, p. 76.

#### Class 9 "Oktoberfest"

(4 entries)

A German Tradition that is celebrated world-wide. Friends will surely join in the fun. Prost! A Functional Table for One (Informal) – Staged on a 30" round high-top cocktail table, 42" from the floor, in front of a neutral-colored wall. With a decorative unit suitable for the space allotted. Designer's choice of plant material and other components. Exhibitor to provide a table covering with a 12" minimum overhang. Viewed from the front. HB, p. 76-77.


