President's Report

The West Trenton Garden Club meeting of November 3, 2025, was called to order at 6:30 by President *Anne Skalka*.

Secretary's Report

The minutes of the Board meeting were emailed to all the Board members and others who were present at the meeting, one minor correction was made, and those minutes were filed as reported. The minutes of the October general membership meeting was printed in the monthly Newsletter. Hearing no additions or corrections, the minutes were filed as reported.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer, *Rick Lazarick*, reported a current balance of \$8,750.91. This balance includes income from the bulb sale (\$938), the 50/50 from September's meeting (\$58), and dues (\$60). Expenses incurred were from the October program stipend (\$275), Birmingham Park plants (\$133.57), and Bulb Sale expenses (\$247.50). Rick also reported that our net profit from the Bulb Sale came to \$640.92. He brought in the amaryllis bulbs for pick-up.
